# Maritime, Ports, and Logistics Management Certificate

This certificate program is designed to help working maritime and port professionals develop and sharpen their maritime and port management skills. The program consists of four graduate courses that expose students to global maritime transport, port management (with a focus on shipbuilding and ship repair logistics), maritime and admiralty law, and maritime security and risk analysis.

## Admission Requirements

Admission to the certificate program will require a bachelor’s degree (or equivalent).

## Curriculum Requirements

The certificate is awarded based upon the student’s successful completion of 12 credit hours of graduate level courses in Ports and Maritime Management:
